Remembrance

Alongside our learning we have also taken time to think about the commemoration of Remembrance at this time of year. Within lessons, a different range of activities have taken place so that students can understand more about why Remembrance is so important to us in Britain and across the world. As a snapshot, students have performed World War poetry in English; they have created blackout poetry displays in Art; listened to and considered the effects of the music of Dame Vera Lynn and George Formby within music lessons; in Science they have studied how Penicillin made a difference to soldiers' lives and in History they have been learning about the fate of local Nuneaton soldiers. It has been a fascinating period of learning across the school linked to war and Remembrance and we will be bringing all activities together within school next week as part of our Remembrance service on Tuesday. We look forward to this being an informative and poignant service for the students, staff and visitors and will share memories from the day with you next week. Some of our students will also be representing our school and laying a wreath on behalf of us all to remember the fallen at Nuneaton's service of Remembrance held by the Town Hall on Sunday. On Wednesday we enjoyed exploring our provision for SEND. Using expertise from within the Trust, several lessons were visited and pupils shared their experiences of being at HLNA so far. It was very pleasing to see pupils thriving and being confident in the classroom with subject teachers using reasonable adjustments to support each pupil's individual needs. It was also wonderful to observe both curriculum and therapeutic based interventions taking place within the North Bridge with pupils demonstrating some of the key skills they are learning during these interventions. We would like to continue now to work on upscaling our expertise and resources as the school grows over time.
